Mid-Autumn Celebration @ KLBC Desa ParkCity





KLBC/DPC Homeschool Combined Camp at OUTBAC Broga

OCTOBER 6-8, 2019



KLBC and DPC Homeschool organized a combined three-day, two-night camp at OUTBAC Broga (OB) from October 6-8, 2019. It was the first time the students from both Homeschool centres were participating in a camp together. A total of seventy-eight students, teachers and pastoral staff joined this camp.

The students and teachers gathered at KLBC Shammah Hall for a short worship session followed by camp briefing and lunch before departing for Broga. All participants were split into groups according to colours. At Broga, each group was given similar tasks to fulfill at various stations around the OB campsite. The groups were required to do commando crawl, wall skimming, rope swinging, milo hunting in the crocodile pit, trust fall, swinging bridge crossing, water sponge tossing, and ball transferring, while competing with other groups in terms of speed and efficient completion of the tasks given. Students were



challenged in their ability to support and encourage one another as well as push themselves beyond their own limitations and expectations.



There was a morning walk and climb to Broga hill the next day under the supervision of the OB instructors and guides. They made it to the top in time to watch the sunrise after which they began the difficult descent back to the OB campsite. After a quick breakfast, the students continued with activities like flying fox, wall climbing, and kayaking until lunch time. All participants took part in a game called "Secret Angel" on the first night after the dinner and worship session. They had to randomly choose a person to show concern and love to during the duration of the camp without revealing their identity. The day continued with campfire after dinner and an indoor activity called "Structure Building" led by Teacher Aldrin.

The challenge was to build a structure within half an hour from one pack of satav sticks which could withstand the weight of three Bibles.

On the last morning of the camp, the students continued with the raft building activity and had a race on the lake with their respective assembled raft. We then concluded our outdoor activities with a group photo session, prize giving and sharing. Many of the students shared they were blessed by their "secret angel" and they were reminded that all of us express and respond to love in different ways. The book on the Five Love Languages by Gary Chapman was recommended as a guide for them to understand the specific love language of their friends. But ultimately, no matter what our love language is, the take-home lesson was that God loves all of us individually and intimately as His love surpasses all others!



House of Hope and Light



House of Hope and Light is a home for the elderly and on September 7, the Charity Department visited the Home that also houses single mothers, special needs children and drug addicts. Most of them were abandoned by their families with some suffering from depression. In spite of their differences, they have learnt to live together as one big family. The person-in-charge was a reformed drug addict who is now serving full-time in the home.



During the visit we gave them some groceries we had brought along as the place is

inaccessible and difficult to locate; making it inconvenient for the staff to shop for their daily provisions. Our members had high tea with them that afternoon and also presented a cheque



from the church as a contribution towards the running of the home.

We were especially inspired by seventy-year old Uncle Boey who cheerfully does devotion with them every morning as well as takes them to church on Sundays. We pray that the Lord will continue to grant him good health as he and the volunteers serve Him so faithfully in this ministry.
