Mission Trip to the Philippines: A Journey of Faith and Service

From 28 April to 5 May 2025, our 3-member team (Rev. John Kok, Sis. Grace Lee and Sis. Carol Lam) embarked on a transformative mission trip to the Philippines, and witnessed God's grace in action across Bulacan, Pampanga, Caloocan, and Laguna. The trip was a divine tapestry of encounters — ministering to children, uplifting the elderly, and sharing the Gospel with communities hungry for hope.

In Bulacan and Pampanga, we joined vibrant children's ministries in San Ildefonso, Sinipit, San Jose and San Rafael, where young hearts worshipped through dance, Bible stories, and games. Despite the rain in Sinipit, their zeal for God shone brightly, embodying 2 Corinthians 3:17- where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom. We also prayed and presented gifts to the elderly, reflecting God's boundless love towards them.

In Caloocan, we visited sponsored children at Llano Baptist Church,



where we were moved by their testimonies of God's faithfulness. Rev. John introduced the Gospel through memorable acrostics like C.O.F.F.E.E (Christ Offers Forgiveness for Everyone Everywhere) and the ABCs of Salvation, challenging young believers to love God, God's Word and God's people.

Laguna brought powerful moments of proclaiming the Gospel to 400 police personnel, witnessing prison ministries led by transformed former inmates, and serving communities through feeding programmes in Talahiban, Lalao, and Buroi, echoing Jesus' miracle of the five loaves (Matthew 14:13-21).



The trip culminated in Sunday worship at Living Water Baptist Church, a humble gathering that radiated the true essence of Acts 2:42 - believers devoting themselves to fellowship, prayer, and breaking of bread.

As we shared meals, prayers, and the Gospel, we saw God knit hearts together in love. This trip was a testament to His faithfulness, reminding us that small acts of obedience can spark profound kingdom impact. We returned home with hearts full of gratitude, a burden for the lost, and a commitment to pray for continued transformation in these communities. To Him be all glory!



Sandakan Mission Trip

Our mission team, consisting of 14 members from KLBC ministered to more than 300 stateless children in the Sandakan area from 13 – 20 October 2025. We partnered with Sandakan Baptist Church (SBC) Filipino Makarios congregation to serve these stateless children who were mainly of Muslim-Filipino descent. We thank God for the many donations from KLBC members who contributed to the purchase of food baskets and monetary gifts for the voluntary teachers and the children (stationeries and girls' clothes). The number of children and families continue to increase and is considered as

one of the most neglected people groups in Sabah. Sabah has the highest number of mosques in the country with 1,127 mosques, in addition to 1,222 surau statewide (as of 21 September 2025). The state government is committed to strengthening the presence of Islam in the coming years. Pray for the Sabah state election in November and for the people to choose leaders of calibre to manage and improve the welfare of the people in this state.

The team visited the Vision School in Sandakan – a local private school that is running the Malaysian Education syllabus with its land given to the Anglican Diocese of Sabah. We explored the future of education set up by the local church, and the various challenges faced by East and West Malaysian churches respectively in providing holistic and competitive options to



parents to place their children in church-based education centres. We were also connected to Rainbow of Hope that operates out of Kota Kinabalu under its current president, Mark Chai. We hope to collaborate with Rainbow of Hope in the future should God bring KLBC mission team back to Sabah.

Pr. John Ng led the Cantonese/Mandarin ministry at SBC and the Baptist Education and Recreation Centre (BERC) during the weekend. The team ministered to about 200 Cantonese/Mandarin-speaking people ranging from children to the elderly. Though not all our team members spoke the language, they contributed in different ways to ensure the sessions ran smoothly. We thank God for the unity among our team members, and their compassion for the people who were in need. We pray that God will send more workers into the mission field and for His people to faithfully contribute to the cause of Missions.
